Affirmation of the day: I am fantastic.

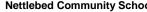

I'm expecting at least four paragraphs in your story.	Use your pink polishing pen (or purple perfecting pen, or blue bettering pen, or red rewriting pen – can't think of a green one) to make three significant improvements to your work. You could add fronted adverbials or a prepositional phrase, improve your words using the thesaurus or expand a noun phrase.
