The Primary PE and Sport Premium

What is the PE Premium finding?

The Primary PE and Sport Premium is a direct grant from the government for Head teachers to allocate in ways they see fit to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. The government has increased the funding during this academic year 2017/2018 to £16,000 plus £10 per pupil. For Nettlebed, this equates to an extra £17,120 specifically for PE and Sport.

How is the money spent at Nettlebed?

The PE pupil premium is spent alongside our ethos of encouraging high quality learning experiences for all children and offering opportunities for those who may not otherwise.

Specialist PE Teacher

We employ a specialist PE teacher who supports PE learning across the school.

This ensures continuity and progression in PE. Our teacher is also the school PE coordinator and manages school participation in Partnership sports fixtures and events. This cost is approximately £10,000.

We also have benefited from specialist coaches throughout the year in TAG rugby and cricket.

Swimming

This year we sent Years 3 - 6 swimming (68 children) for a term. We are also paying for up to three swimming teachers to lead the sessions and ensure small group numbers. This will cost approximately £2000.

The Headteachers of the Woodcote Partnership jointly employ a member of staff to run and organise

a packed calendar of inter-school competitive sports fixtures and events. Our contribution is £1200. This provides a range of competitive opportunities and also targets key vulnerable groups. So far this year our children have taken part in:

- 9 Cross-country competitions (years 1-6)
- 5 football tournaments (KS2 boys and girls)
- Climbing
- Sports hall athletics
- Orienteering (year 3,4 and 5)
- 2 netball tournaments
- Hockey masterclass
- · Inter-house netball and cross country

Sports equipment

We have contributed £3000 towards the new Multi-Use Games Area in conjunction with the Community Joint Use Committee (JUC) and FONS.

We have also invested money in equipment for the playground to ensure active playtimes. This has included training our Year 5s as playgrounds leaders. This has cost approximately £900

What impact does the spending have on the lives of the children?

The money has been invested to ensure that every child has had a sporting experience outside of Nettlebed School and has had an opportunity to take part in a competitive activity. It has also meant that we have forged links with local clubs in order to promote children's activity levels and skills outside of the school community.

All of our Key Stage 2 children have swum for a term and 85% (16/19) of the year 6s leave Nettlebed being able to swim confidently and competently over 25metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform a self-rescue in the water.

Children have had opportunities to work with a range of children from across the partnership and have had opportunities to be leaders in events such as orienteering. The expertise of the staff involved also means that all colleagues feel supported in their delivery of PE and standards are maintained.

The children have won multiple awards at Cross country and qualified for the South Oxon Football finals. Through our partnership work, the children nominate someone in the Olympic spirit and thus sportsmanship is fostered.

Other investments in equipment and infrastructure means that children have the benefit of a great sports area to be used in all weathers and the equipment to encourage creative and active play times.

Future Actions

- Look at future spend on active lessons and curriculum time to maximise time.
- Develop outdoor agenda to enable activities both during curriculum time and play time.
